On **Friday, March 11, 2016**, the Chicago Bach Project returns for its sixth presentation, with Bach's momentous **Mass in B Minor**. This work was Bach's final achievement, transcending the historical period and religious functions to become what many consider to be the greatest composition in Western classical music. In the weeks leading up to the Chicago Bach Project March 11 performance of the *Mass in B Minor*, SDG is offering two special pre-concert events.

***“The Mass as a Musical Form:
History and Debate”
Panel Discussion***

Interesting questions lie behind Bach’s *Mass in B Minor*. For starters, why would this most celebrated Lutheran composer set the Mass in Latin, instead

of the German vernacular of the Protestant Church of his day? Why did Bach never hear this work performed during his lifetime? How did the showpiece masses of the 16th century become resurrected in the 18th century, from devotional works to concert works? A panel of religion and music scholars will explore these issues as a prelude to a deeper understanding of this Bach masterpiece.

***“A Bach Briefing”
Conductor John Nelson***

Maestro Nelson will offer an inside look at how he approaches Bach’s *Mass in B Minor* and provide the background story about how this compilation of pieces came to be the monumental

concert work performed today. Demonstrating excerpts from the piano, Nelson will also explore the underlying symbolism, as well as Bach’s fascination with numbers, which he hid within the notes and musical structure of the piece.



The recording ensemble, Cor Cantiamo, will make a special appearance to preview selected tracks from the new *Psallite* CD. The choir's founder and conductor, Eric A. Johnson, will share his insights about the shared themes among the pieces, as well as his experiences working with the recording engineers from Abbey Road Studios. .

Stretching from the 16th century to the current decade, *Psallite* offers an hour-long feast of inspirational singing. Primarily a cappella, the works are based on Psalm texts or follow the tradition of the Psalms, and the selections include Renaissance motets, traditional spirituals, and five works commissioned for SDG's Psalms Project.


