ABOUT BACH IN BALTIMORE

Bach In Baltimore is a monthly concert series, which showcases the works of Johann Sebastian Bach and other Baroque composers. Comprised of amateur and professional musicians, Bach In Baltimore provides a cultural resource for the Baltimore metropolitan area. Performances feature a guest choir, ensemble and/or soloist that share the stage in these monthly concerts.

The Bach In Baltimore *Student Voice Exchange* is a Maryland-based, youth-in-music initiative. The *Student Voice Exchange* provides both music and performance education, and offers monthly opportunities for Bach In Baltimore to share the stage with up and coming musicians. In addition to performing in the concert series, the young musicians work with Maestro Dimmock during visits to the students' spaces, in rehearsals and classes.
