Ronald Stolk, Organ

Ronald Stolk studied music in The Hague and Paris. He is a laureate of several international competitions in organ playing and improvisation, and received the Bach Prize of the City of Wiesbaden, Germany and First Prize in the American Guild of Organists' National Competition in Organ Improvisation. He is organist and choirmaster pro tem of St. James' Episcopal Church, Capitol Hill.

The program includes the Prelude and Fugue in G Major, BWV 568, Sonata IV in E minor, BWV 528, Passacaglia, BWV 582 and chorale preludes from the *Orgelbüchlein*.

The program is a celebration of trio sonatas including the sonatas for flute and obbligato harpsichord in E minor and E major (respectively BWV 1034 and 1035), Trio Sonata in G Major, BWV 1039, and trio sonatas by Telemann and Vivaldi. There will be a CD release party after the concert at the church for their new CD entitled: "Bach's Lunch."
